ABW Ministries

November 19th will be our regular monthly meeting at **9:30 a.m. in Elliott Hall**. Jan Lee will be hostess. Our local mission project will be handwarmers for the Homeless Coalition. All women are invited to join us.

Our ABWM Central region project for 2025-26 is for \$30,000 to be split between Camp Christy, Scott City, Ks. and Kodiak Baptist Mission in Alaska. We will be learning more about these opportunities in the future meetings.

International Ministries (IM) is providing \$20,000 in One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) emergency disaster relief funds to assist IM partners in the Caribbean with food and supplies as Hurricane Melissa bears down on Jamaica, Cuba, and Haiti. IM's emergency relief funds will help address the immediate survival needs, covering food, shelter, and emergency supplies to alleviate suffering.

Urgent Prayer Requests

IM calls for prayers in the face of this crisis:

- For Those Displaced and Affected: Pray for comfort, safety, and resilience for families who have been evacuated or lost their homes. Ask for peace and strength as they face uncertainty and rebuild their lives.
- For Restoration of Critical Resources: Pray for the swift restoration of electricity, clean water, and communication systems across. Ask for protection against potential health crises due to the lack of clean water and limited medical access.
- For Long-Term Recovery and Resilience: Pray for the rebuilding efforts to be effective and sustainable, especially in restoring homes and infrastructure. Ask for wisdom for leaders and communities to strengthen their resilience against future disasters.

Area Director for Iberoamerica and the Caribbean, Rev. Dr. Adalia Gutierrez Lee shares, "International Ministries remains committed to walking alongside our global partners to help restore hope and rebuild lives.

In the coming days and weeks, we will work with our partners to assess the evolving needs in Jamaica, Cuba, and Haiti and expand our support where it is needed most. We invite our supporters to join us through prayer and sharing this urgent call with others."

ABWM Book of Month HAGGAI

Author:, The "Prophet of the Temple" was reputed to have been born during, or after, the seventy years' captivity in Babylon, and to have returned to Jerusalem with Zerubbabel. He was a colleague of Zechariah. [Ezra 5:1, 6:14.]

MAIN THEME. Sharp rebukes for neglecting to rebuild the temple, coupled with encouraging exhortations and promises to those undertaking the work. **Key Text**, 2-4,".. Be Strong O Zerubbabel. Be strong O. Joshua.....Be strong all you people..for I am with you, declares the Lord Almighty.

HISTORICAL OCCASION The remnant that had returned from Captivity were selfishly preoccupied with their own affairs, and were more concerned in beautifying their own dwellings than rebuilding the Lord's house. The work has ceased for years. 1:4.

THE MESSAGE

- (1) A cutting reproof, showing that God had withheld his natural blessings, because his temple was left in ruins. 1:3-11.
- **(2) Words of encouragement** as the work of rebuilding the temple was resumed. 1:12-15.
- (3) Inspiring promises to the older people who had seen Solomon's temple and were discouraged at the inferiority of the structure they were able to build, 2.3. They were told of a coming manifestation of divine power and the appearing of the Messiah, when the glory of the Lord would fill the house, 2:7-9.
- **(4) A reminder of their unworthiness** to erect a house for the Lord of Hosts, 2:10-14.
- (5) Predictions of the doom, Hope for Haggai, but judgment for kingdoms lead by human beings who don't recognize the sovereignty of God. Haggai 2:20-23. Haggai's prophecy was about the messiah. Divine Topics: Presence v.4, Power v.6, Glory v.7, Peace, v9.

Note: Zerubbabel was in the family line of Jesus (Matthew 1:12-13). NIV [sources NIV, Halley's Bible Hand Book 4259-]
