



Every Moment Holy: Volume 2 “A Liturgy for Moments of Uncertainty”

Uncertainty. Uncertainty surrounds us in many ways and in different spaces. Some would argue that we are yet again in a season of uncertainty while others claim that it has been the norm since 2020. Our world seems to be tittering on the unknown. This feeling of uncertainty has invaded our lives. We turn on the TV, open our phones, turn the newspaper page wondering what will happen next, expecting for the worst and preparing for whatever. Though uncertainty is a part of the human experience it does not make it easier to navigate or negate our experiences. Friends, in the midst of such uncertainty, I keep being drawn back to this liturgy. The word liturgy was derived from the Greek term meaning the work of the people. The work of this faith community is to support one another as we try to once again rest in Jesus. Jesus who we know to be the Prince of Peace, the Wonderful Counselor, the Rising Sun, the Emmanuel, and the Liberating King. Christ is with us. While uncertainty will continue to lurk in awaiting medical diagnoses, mourning those separated from us on earth, ministry to the community, and the political landscape, we gather to proclaim that we trust in God’s promises. Deuteronomy 31:6 reminds us that “...the LORD your God will personally go ahead of you. He will neither fail you nor abandon you.” God promises that even in the most peculiar of times we will have peace. Peace in the presence of a God that loves us and cares deeply for our anxieties, frustrations, doubts, and uncertainties. May we be certain in one thing: that God’s loving presence will go with us. I hope you use this liturgy this month when you find the uncertainty of life to be overwhelming. Let us try, even if we must try each hour, to rest once again in Jesus’s love and grace for all of creation.
