- Sister Joan Chittister The end of November and beginning of December mark for us the ending of the church calendar cycle (called the Lectionary). The Church's new year starts on the first Sunday of Advent (November 30). Advent is a unique opportunity for us to embrace what it means to wait. None of us like to wait. That is why we have fastfood, robots thinking for us, and automatic machines. As the saying goes, "never pray for patience cause God might hear you." The Advent season invites us to flex spiritual muscles that might have atrophied over the past year because of busyness or varied circumstances. In the upcoming month as we prepare to celebrate the miraculous birth of Jesus and while waiting for his Second Coming the church season can point us to hope now. I did not know Advent existed or was celebrated until I was in college. First Baptist Church in Waco, TX lit these majestic candles and read words that speak to our deepest yearnings for all things to made new in Christ. This experience opened my faith to the way traditions can breathe newness into familiarity. If Advent is new to you or if this is not your first rodeo, I invite you to listen to the words sung, read, and preached. As we begin the season together, we are reminded that this journey in the midst of waiting can create space for us to lean into faith. Each Sunday, Advent candles representing hope, peace, love, and joy will be lit during worship. The four candles prepare us to light the Christ Candle on Christmas Eve. These small candles signify for us the power of "The light [shining] in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5). Christ is our light in the darkness, the storm, and the confusion of the world. Later in John's gospel account, Jesus declares, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." (John 8:12). During Advent, as the candles are lit may they light within us hope that darkness will not and cannot overcome us. Let us stretch our spiritual muscles while we wait. Perhaps, we will even find that God is in the places we least expect calling us to deeper hope. Together, we wait and hope in the Light of the World. If you get impatient know that you are in good company. May this time hone our light spotting skills and send us out to be light in our community.

# ABWM FBC OTTAWA December Book of the Month Matthew

**PURPOSE**: Prove that Jesus is the Messiah, the eternal King. Matthew (Levi) wrote this book especially for the Jews. Matthew was a Jewish tax collector who became one of Jesus' disciples. This Gospel forms the connecting link between the Old and New testaments because of its emphasis on the fulfillment of prophecy. "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets: I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them" (5:17). We meet Jesus, Mary, Joseph, John the Baptist, the disciples, the religious leaders, Caiaphas, Pilate, & Mary Magdalene. The setting is in Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Capernaum, Galilee, and Judea. The book of Matthew is filled with messianic language ("Son of David" is used throughout) and old Testament references (53 quotes and 76 other references). This Gospel was not written as a chronological account; its purpose was to present the clear evidence that Jesus is the Messiah, the Savior. \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

Matthew 24:4-6 "You will hear of wars and reports of wars. See that you are not disturbed; for these things must happen......" \*Matthew 24:2 It is time, God will not abandon this world He created. He is not finished with us yet. Humanity is selfish, self centered and down right evil. Warning, watch that no one deceives you. Many false prophets will be selling lies. Pay attention to the signs of the times. Trust and obey. The truth is God has not given up on us yet. This world is facing certain judgment and a new creation. Justice and mercy is God's nature. HIS plan is not total destruction but the creation of a world nearer to his heart's desire. But the Church will be persecuted. Watch. Danger: false teachers, deception, temptations. Be Strong, Be Courageous, Be Kind. The King is coming, no one knows the day or the hour, only the Father knows.[v. 36] Our goal is to be ready, be faithful and true to our savior, one day at a time as if it is TODAY. [Matthew is a book that is impossible to give a proper review in one column. We all need to be diligent in the study of the book of Matthew.]
